

# CLEAN LA Solar

CLEAN LA Solar allows multifamily residential and commercial property owners to generate energy for the city's power grid through rooftop solar panels, and sell the power to the LA Department of Water and Power (LADWP). This policy is known as a feed-in-tariff (FIT), and is one of the best mechanisms to promote clean, solar energy.

The Clean LA Solar (Feed-in Tariff) Program will install 150MW of solar Los Angeles by 2016, making it the largest rooftop solar program in the country. Clean LA Solar's 100MW Set Pricing Program is offered by LADWP in 20MW tranches every six months. The program's fourth tranche will begin accepting applications in Q3 2014.

- Applications for each tranche are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis with a lottery drawing if oversubscribed.
- 30 kW to 3 MW renewable projects within LADWP service territory are eligible.
- 4 MW from each tranche are reserved for small projects under 150 kw.
- Commercial, industrial, warehouse, institutional, and multifamily residential buildings are eligible for the program.
- Up to a 20 year fixed-price contract term.
- The 4<sup>th</sup> tranche will be offered at a price of \$0.14/kWh.
- Projects have 18 months to achieve commercial operation after contract execution with LADWP.

## **Clean LA Solar provides an opportunity for building owners to earn a 20-year return from solar energy generated on their roof.**

- Building owners may choose to own their system, or lease their roof to a solar provider.
- Increases property value and provides a unique marketing point.

- Creates a greener Los Angeles by encouraging local solar and reducing the city's reliance on polluting, coal-fired power plants.

- Over 40% of proposed CLEAN LA Solar projects are located in solar equity "hot spots" - neighborhoods with abundant rooftop space for solar installations that also have significant need for economic and environmental investment.
