

On Sunday, October 28, 2012, the Neighborhood Council of Westchester/Playa will hold its board elections along with a number of other Neighborhood Councils on the Westside.

This is your opportunity to get involved, select those candidates who will serve on your Neighborhood Council and make a difference in your community.

Think of your Neighborhood Council as a group of local residents and representatives of local businesses, churches and schools, etc., working together to address important issues in our neighborhood.

As part of the city's Charter, Neighborhood Councils are an integral part of how local government operates, providing elected officials with a direct line to the community and how it stands on all issues.

The election for the Neighborhood Council of Westchester/Playa board of directors will be held from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Westchester Municipal Building Community Room at 7166 West Manchester Avenue in Westchester.

The election is open to any member of the community who is at least 18 years of age on the date of the election and lives, works or owns property in Zip Codes 90293, 90045 or 90094. According to the election procedures approved by the City of Los Angeles, voters must verify their stakeholder status by providing acceptable documentation. Stakeholder status may also be established by means of declaring a stake (or interest) in the neighborhood and providing acceptable documentation. Factual Basis Stakeholders will also be required to provide a form of documentation to substantiate their factual basis claim to vote for the At-Large Affirmation Seat - the only seat for which Factual Basis Stakeholders may vote.

Every voter planning to vote in the election must bring with them to the polling location proof of stakeholder status, including driver's license, utility bill, property tax statement, pay stub, business tax registration certificate or other documentation that proves they live, work or own property in Zip Codes 90293, 90045 or 90094. Thoae who do not provide this proof will be given a provisional ballot, which will not be counted until stakeholder status can be verified.

ON THE BALLOT ...

About half of the seats on the Neighborhood Council's board of directors will be up for election.
