The Airport Relations Committee voted 3-0 (with 1 abstain) to oppose the Airfield and Terminal Modernization Project as proposed by LAWA in the Draft Environmental Report (DEIR) released on October 29, 2020.

BACKGROUND:

The impact of the project on Air Quality, Greenhouse Gas Emissions, Noise and Transportation/Traffic will result in "Significant Unavoidable Impacts" and as such will have significant negative impacts on our community.

We have reviewed the 10,000-page ATMP DEIR to the best of our ability with assistance from both LAWA and the City of Los Angeles. And while we are very appreciative of their assistance, we still believe more should be done to mitigate the negative aspects of this project. No additional information from LADOT/LAX non-CEQA analysis was provided.
