RECOMMENDATION:

That the Neighborhood Council of Westchester / Playa (NCWP) approve the expenditure of \$2000.00 to Airport Marina Counseling Services that supports mental health services for individuals including school children in our community.

BACKGROUND:

In April 2022, the Community Services Committee approved a motion to recommend a Neighborhood Purposes Grant to Airport Marina Counseling Services in the amount of up to \$2000.00. For the last 50 years, Airport Marina Counseling Services has supported our community by providing low cost and reduced cost mental health services including counseling to the folks in our communities who need it most and otherwise could not afford the services.

DISCUSSION:

They expect the need for their services will continue to grow as the mental health of our community, especially our youth has been greatly impacted by the pandemic.

FISCAL ANALYSIS:

This request reduces the Neighborhood Council's allocated funds by \$2000.00, the Council currently has a surplus.
